- **Cloth Bank Initiative**

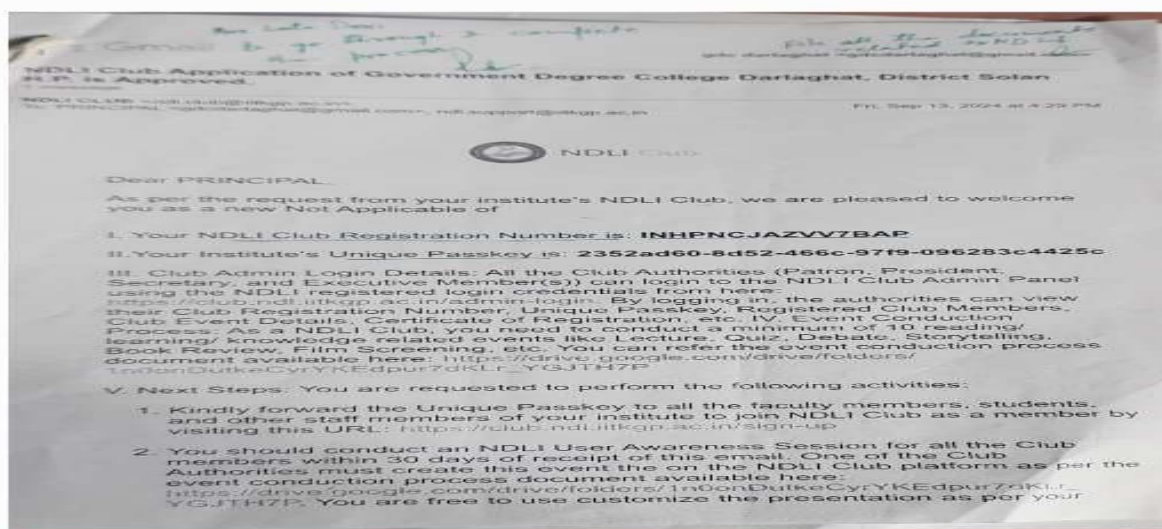
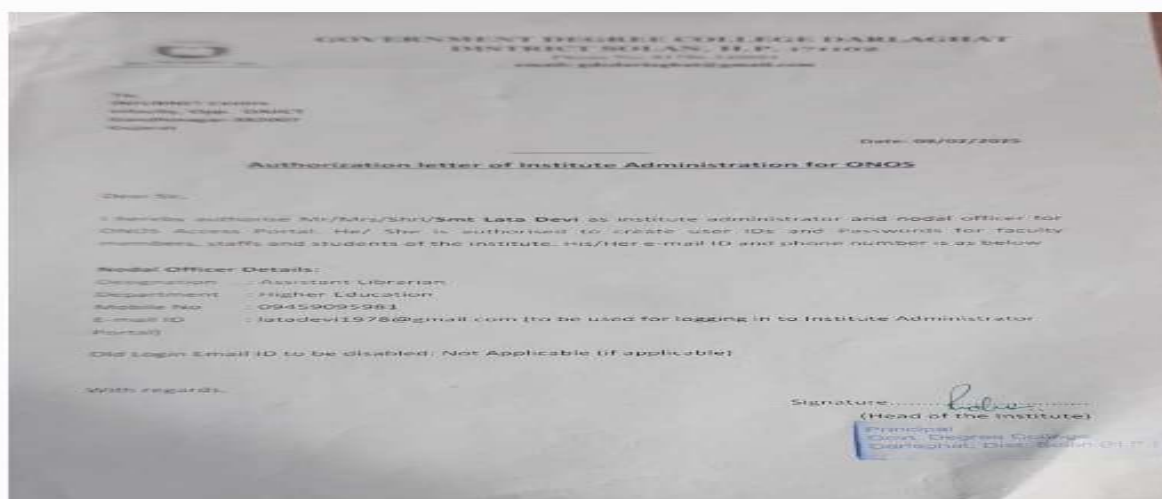

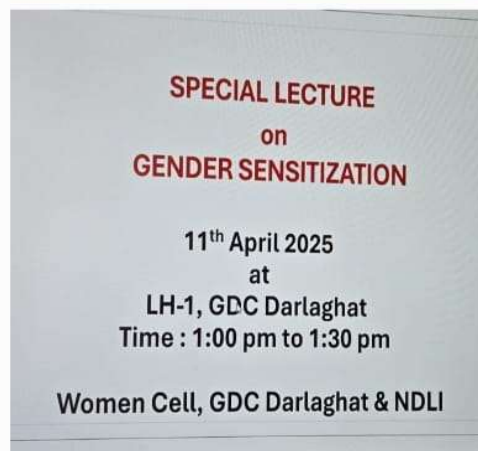
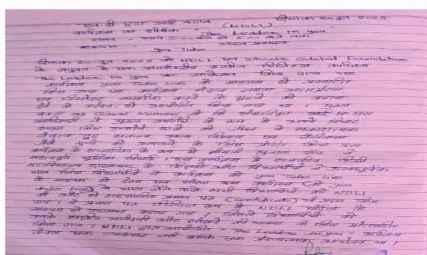
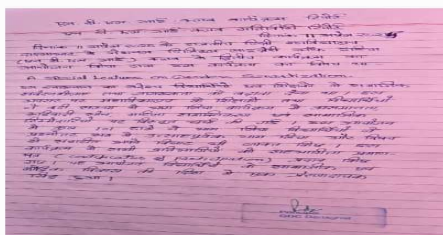
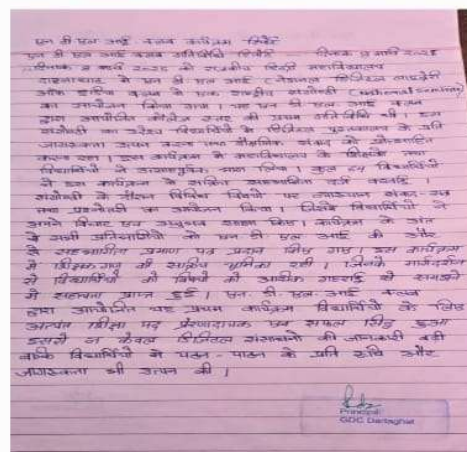
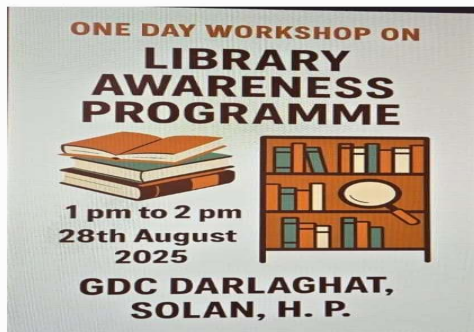


- **NDLI Initiative**

The **National Digital Library of India (NDLI)** promotion is a special initiative of the college undertaken by the Library to support students' academic growth. Through NDLI, awareness sessions, seminars, and lectures are organized to enhance research skills and digital literacy.

Heritage Visit – Department of History

The Department of History undertook a special heritage initiative to promote historical awareness and experiential learning among students. On 15 August 2024, four final-year students visited Rashtrapati Niwas The Retreat to participate in Independence Day celebrations and explore its 175-year-old architectural and historical legacy. From 27–29 October 2024, an educational tour to Manali and Lahaul was organized for third-year students, including visits to Roerich Art Gallery and Hidimba Devi Temple. These visits enhanced students' understanding of art, architecture, and cultural heritage. (Verifiable from Subject Society Register of Department of History)







- On 2 December 2025, the Department of History organized a Heritage Walk in Shimla, from Viceregal Lodge to Christ Church, Shimla. The walk was organized to acquaint students of history to the colonial architecture of Shimla, its history and how the city came to be built in a way that served the colonial purpose. The walk included several stops along the way including structures like the Old Railway Board Building, Gorton Castle, Grand Hotel, Bantony Castle, Gaiety Theatre and Town Hall complex, and the iconic State Library and Christ Church.
